John 'Hannibal' Smith is a master tactician with unconventional methods, and leader of a group of Iraq War veterans intent on clearing their name after being convicted for a crime for which they were framed. Each member of the group is unique: Lt. Templeton 'Face' Peck has good looks and charm, which are both his strength and weakness; Capt. 'Howling Mad' Murdock is a highly intelligent chopper pilot with a genius I.Q. but mentally unstable; and Sgt. Bosco 'B.A.' Baracus is a hot-tempered, super-skilled driver and mechanic who can make anything work from ordinary parts. 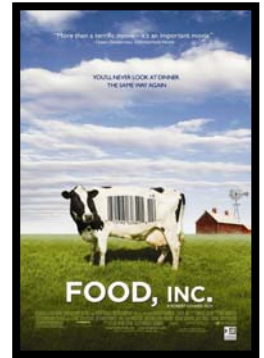


FOOD INC

Documentary, Rated PG, 94 Minutes

Featuring: Michael Pollan, Eric Schlosser

Filmmaker Robert Kenner argues that health and safety - of the food itself, of the animals, of the workers on the assembly lines, and of the consumers actually eating the food - are often overlooked in the giant US food production industry. Worse, much of it is deliberately hidden by corporations protecting their interests and even by regulatory agencies such as the USDA and FDA. Bigger breasted chickens, herbicide resistant soya beans and limitless supplies of minced hamburger beef all come at a price - including the danger of E. Coli bacteria that causes illness in an estimated 73,000 Americans annually. **Available December 6.**



GET HIM TO THE GREEK

Mild-mannered but ambitious 24-year-old Aaron Greenberg has just landed his dream assignment. Aaron's record-mogul boss Sergio Roma is staging a comeback concert for fallen British rock-star Aldous Snow at the Los Angeles Greek Theatre, as the first stop in a multi-million dollar tour, and wants Aaron to escort the star from London. Aldous, who lives in his self-obsessed world with pleasures of the flesh and all things illegal, is also searching for the meaning of life - between joints, booze and sex, that is. He has never really recovered from the breakup of his relationship with raunchy singer and model Jackie Q. As the countdown begins, Aaron is up to his ears in problems getting his unco-operative, certifiable rock-star charge to the concert. **Available January 3.**

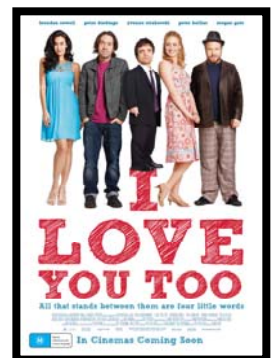


I LOVE YOU, TOO

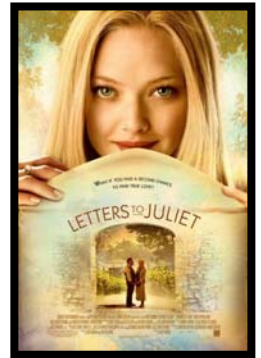


LETTERS TO JULIET

Lizzy can't believe her luck when she finds Tink trapped in the fairy house she has placed in the garden. Meanwhile, as the fairies mount a daring rescue, a friendship develops between Tink and the little girl whose busy, pragmatic father has no time for her and is only interested in scientific facts. 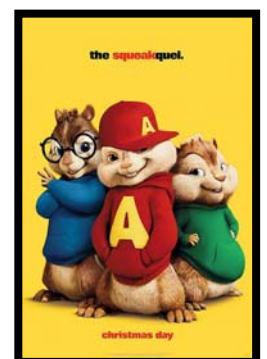


ALVIN & THE CHIPMUNKS 2: THE SQUEAKUEL

Pop sensations Alvin, Simon and Theodore end up in the care of Dave Seville's twenty-something nephew Toby. The boys must put aside music superstardom to return to school, and are tasked with saving the school's music program by winning the \$25,000 prize in a battle of the bands. But the Chipmunks unexpectedly meet their match in three singing chipmunks known as "The Chipettes" – Brittany, Eleanor and Jeanette.



AVATAR

Science-Fiction/Drama, Rated M, 162 Minutes

Starring: Sam Worthington, Zoë Saldana, Sigourney Weaver

Paraplegic war vet Jake Sully is sent to the exotic planet Pandora, replacing his brother who was killed. Although he's part of the military under the command of Col. Miles Quaritch, the human presence is driven by a corporation mining a unique mineral alongside a scientific probe directed by Dr Grace Augustine. Humans cannot breathe Pandoran air, so they genetically engineer human/Na'vi hybrids known as Avatars. The indigenous Na'vi are resentful - but Princess Neytiri befriends him and becomes his guide and protector on the strange planet. Jake is soon caught in the middle of the conflict between the Na'vi and the human military machine raping their world.



BLIND SIDE

Michael Oher, a homeless and undereducated African-American youngster from a broken home in Memphis, is taken in by the Touhys, a well-to-do white family of Leigh Anne Touhy, her businessman husband Sean, and their children Collins and S.J. At first, Leigh Anne is simply helping a needy boy in the short term - but it soon becomes long term, as the introverted and gentle but physically imposing Michael discovers a talent for sport. Living in his new environment, the teen faces a completely different set of challenges to overcome. As a football player and student, Oher works hard and with the help of his coaches and adopted family, becomes a successful football player.



BRAN NUE DAE

In the summer of 1967, young Willie is filled with the life in Broome - fishing, hanging out with his mates and hoping to get a date with the lovely Rosie. However his mother returns him to the religious mission in Perth for further schooling on the path to be a priest. After being punished for an act of youthful rebellion by Father Benedictus, he runs away from the mission and heads back to Broome, meeting a hippy couple and Uncle Tadpole along the way. Their trip takes them through adventures with Roadhouse Betty and Roxanne, before their final pit stop at the local watering hole, where Rosie is singing up a storm. But when the bedtime stories he tells the children begin to come true, Skeeter starts to believe he has a chance to change his destiny and replace Kendall as hotel General Manager and future husband to Barry's spoilt daughter Violet.



DATE NIGHT

Claire and Phil Foster are a typical suburban couple from New Jersey whose lives - including their weekly date nights of dinner and a movie - have become routine. To reignite the marital spark, they hire a babysitter and make an impromptu, no-reservation visit to a trendy Manhattan bistro. Not taking no for an answer, they find a way to stay - but a case of mistaken identity turns their romantic evening into a dangerous adventure involving gangsters, large scale bribery and crooked cops. In desperation, they seek help from a one time real estate client of Claire's, the resourceful (and super-fit) Holbrook. In fear for their lives, they have to come up with a plan to survive, and re-discover the bond between them.



FANTASTIC MR. FOX

Mr. Fox has a natural talent for getting out of scrapes in pursuit of chicken stealing - although after a near-miss some years earlier when Mrs. Fox announced she was pregnant, he had vowed to stop living dangerously. But surrounded by temptation - a chicken farm, a squab farm and a cider distillery - he again succumbs to the thrill of the chase - and gets his family and some of their neighbouring wildlife, into heaps of trouble. The farmers, led by Franklin Bean, decide to put an end to him once and for all.



ICE AGE 3: DAWN OF THE DINOSAURS

After the events of "Ice Age: The Meltdown", life begins to change for Manny and his friends; Scrat is still on the hunt to hold onto his beloved acorn; Manny and Ellie are expecting a baby, which leaves Manny anxious to ensure that everything is perfect for when his baby arrives; Diego is fed up with being treated like a house-cat and ponders the notion that he is becoming too laid-back; and Sid begins to wish for a family of his own, and so steals some dinosaur eggs. This leads to Sid ending up in a strange underground world where his herd must rescue him, while dodging dinosaurs and facing danger left and right, and meeting up with a one-eyed dinosaur-hunter weasel known as Buck.

When Sophie finds her mum's tell-all diary of those days, she finds the details of three men: Sam Carmichael, Harry Bright and Bill. Desperate to find out which is her father, she fakes invitations from her mother to her looming island wedding to Sky. When the three men arrive, the dynamics of the relationships are radically changed, as are many lives. **Due to legal restrictions, the Singalong version of Mamma Mia! is not available for outdoor screenings.**



NANNY MCPHEE AND THE BIG BANG

In wartime Britain, Nanny McPhee appears at the door of a harried young mother, Mrs. Isabel Green, who is trying to run the family farm while her husband is away at war. But once she's arrived, Nanny McPhee discovers that Mrs. Green's children are fighting a war of their own against two spoiled city cousins who have just moved in. Money is tight and gambling addict Uncle Phil, who owns half the farm, tries to persuade Isabel under false pretences to sell. Through the ups and downs as strange things occur, Nanny McPhee proves herself to be invaluable as she uses her magic to teach her charges five important lessons.



NIGHT AT THE MUSEUM: BATTLE OF THE SMITHSONIAN
